# From your rector...

Every week at our staff meeting, we do a few things. We open with Bible study, we talk about the calendar and we pray for all of those on our prayer list. We do other things, but those are the things that are most consistent. This past week when we discussed the church calendar, we were a little overwhelmed. In the summer, churches typically cut back on programming. However, at St. John's we have a lot going on this summer, most of which is outreach oriented. On May 30<sup>th</sup> we

are breaking ground for the Habitat house we are sponsoring. Soon you will be learning about how to sign up to help with this amazing project. You don't have to know how to use tools to help! On that very same day, our summer lunch program will begin. We will be feeding 60-100 people every Wednesday for the whole summer. Kay Perry is once again leading this endeavor and signups will appear soon.

In June we will continue with both of those projects and have a project after the 10:30 service on Father's Day. This project will be specifically geared toward children and adults! It will be something that people of every age can do. In July we will have our Rise Against Hunder event which has been very popular over the last few years. I know this seems like a lot, but we will have a lot of help on the Habitat house. While we are the lead sponsor, there will be three or four other churches contributing money and volunteer hours.

There is a well-known passage in the Gospel of Matthew where Jesus tells a parable about a king addressing a group of people. He thanks some people in the group for helping him when he was in need. He was hungry and they gave him food. He was thirsty and they gave him a drink. He was a stranger and they welcomed him. He was sick and they took care of him. He was in prison and they visited him. The people are confused because they did not remember seeing the king like this or helping him at any time. They ask him when they saw him like this. The king replied, "Truly I tell you, just as you did it to one of the least of these who are members of my family, you did it to me." They did not actually help the king, but in helping others, they were serving the king as well.

The people who we will be helping this summer are mostly strangers. The people we help with the Stop Hunger Now program live in another country. We will never even meet them. The people who will move into the house we build will be our neighbors as the house is only a few blocks away. The people who we feed at the summer lunch don't all have places to call a home.

Most of the people we will serve this summer are strangers to us, but they are not strangers to God. They are God's family, which means they are part of our family. One of our readings for the Easter season calls us to love not just in word and speech but in truth and action. This summer, we have many opportunities to love God's family in truth and action. Consider it a crash course in Christianity and get involved in as many ways as you can. We are so fortunate to have these opportunities to serve our neighbors and God. I look forward to serving alongside of you!
